"We strive for our patients' optimal health by treating the entire person, not only the specific area that is causing discomfort."

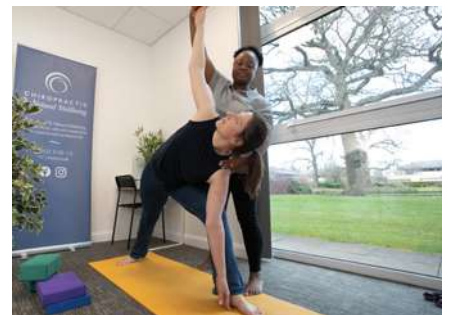
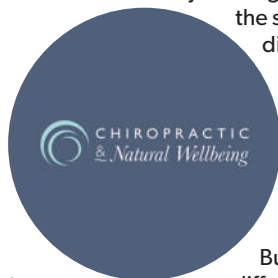
She says the Covid-19 pandemic and resulting lockdowns have resulted in more interest in employee welfare.

ROLLS-ROYCE COLLEAGUES WALK FOR UKRAINE

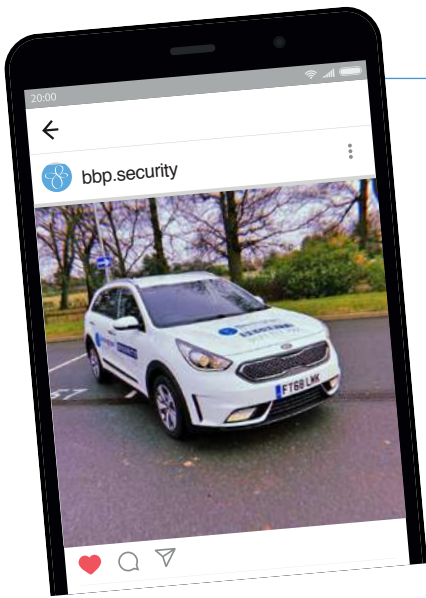
Rolls-Royce colleagues in the PTO team at the Derwent building on the BBP are raising money for the people impacted by the war in Ukraine by donating to the British Red Cross appeal. Activities include collectively walking the total distance between the Rolls-Royce Derwent building and Ukraine, a samosas and cake sale, garden games and wearing blue and yellow.

The fundraising was inspired by a Rolls-Royce colleague, who is raising money for Ukrainian refugees in his birth country of Moldova. He is walking from Rolls-Royce Bristol to the Rolls-Royce Derwent building to raise funds

to renovate a building in Moldova to host Ukrainian refugees with disabilities.

A spokesperson said: "We know that many people including children are having to walk to the borders of neighbouring countries to escape the conflict. With this in mind, we thought that collectively we could walk from the Derwent facility to Ukraine. That's 1,800km! "Split between 450 people, it would be 4km each which is approximately an hour's walk."

For everyone taking part in activities, a recommended donation of £2 is being given to the Red Cross appeal.

BBP businesses host careers day for charity

 Birmingham Business Park is hosting a series of Careers Experience Days in partnership with Heart of England Community Rail Partnership (CRP) and New Leaf Initiative for marginalised young people to explore careers in the railway industry.

The careers days provide pathways into secure employment through motivational sessions, vocational education, employment academies, focus groups and work experience & volunteering opportunities.

Those attending also get to join the monthly Netwalk on the Business Park, which is a great chance to talk to others based on the Business Park whilst visiting the park's woodland and allotment areas.

The Heart of England CRP has been established to bring together rail industry partners, local authorities, businesses, and communities to help maximise the economic, social, and environmental benefits of the rail network to residents, businesses, and visitors. With Birmingham Business Park a five-minute bus ride from the station, it is ideally located to encourage employees to use the railways to get to work.

The New Leaf Initiative C.I.C. is an award-winning prison to employment specialist operating in the West Midlands. New Leaf was born out of consultation and their aim is to hear, value and amplify the voices of the communities they serve.

Lori Henebury, Marketing, Community and Business Development Manager for Birmingham Business Park, organised inspirational talks from Chris Powles, Head of Business Development and Improvement at Sulzer, Kam Hundal, Business Partner – Skills & Employment & Nick Cuming, Stakeholder Manager from Balfour Beatty VINCI, highlighting career opportunities available in infrastructure and engineering.

The New Leaf Initiative CIC have developed a trainee pre-employment training course that focusses on a coaching, mentoring and employability linking to the railways with the New Leaf Initiative CIC. Trainees spend two weeks with New Leaf where they learn



functional skills such as how to write a CV and get ongoing support to help them gain meaningful employment.

Julia Singleton-Tasker, Community Rail Partnership Officer at Heart of England CRP, said: "Our day at Birmingham Business Park was brilliant. Lori organised a great day for our participants on the project and it was eye opening to see the huge amount of employment opportunities that are at the park and only a short train ride away from Birmingham and Coventry. We're looking forward to working more with Birmingham Business Park and the organisations who took the time to give us such a warm welcome there."

Marie-Claire O'Brien, CEO and Founder of New Leaf Initiative, said: "Bringing our trainees to Birmingham Business Park to meet with a variety of different people and businesses such as Sulzer and Balfour Beatty VINCI has been invaluable.

"Some of the trainees have had little idea about what they wanted to do as a career, so this really clarified things for a few of them who are now going to sign up to the construction course and one of our trainees is even considering

the rail industry. We are always grateful to businesses that open their doors to us, for taster days and as employers looking to diversify their work stream with young people who could probably be classed as furthest from the labour market when they start with us due to their pasts, learning difficulties and living environments."


Chris Powles, Head of Business Development and Improvement – Services UK, Sulzer, added: "It was great to spend some time with the New Leaf team to discuss career opportunities with people in our local community who are looking to make a positive difference with their lives."

HS2: Latest news from the Interchange area



 High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Near Birmingham Business Park, HS2 is working around the A452, A45 and M42, which surround the site of the future HS2 Interchange Station. Early works for HS2 in this area, which is referred to as the Interchange area, are being carried out by Laing O'Rourke and J. Murphy & Sons, known as LM, and main works are being carried out by Balfour Beatty VINCI, known as BBV. Find out more about HS2 in Solihull at: hs2.org.uk/solihull

LM BEGIN TO WIND DOWN

To ensure that the local road network is fit for purpose when Interchange Station is operational, LM is remodelling and improving the existing road network near BBP and creating new routes west of the M42 on HS2 land. LM will conclude this programme in summer 2022 before the Birmingham Commonwealth Games kick-off. LM's phased traffic measures on and around Northway Island, and along short sections of the A452, A446, B4438, M42 and Northway are therefore decreasing in frequency month on month until their works are complete. During LM's activities, access to and from the park may alter but will always be maintained either via Progress Way or off Northway Island.

BBV'S WORKS CONTINUE

BBV is remodelling and improving the remainder of the road network east of the M42 on HS2 land, which to date has included creating internal haul roads, importing materials and earthworks. BBV's construction of the Pool Wood embankment, to carry the HS2 trainline towards Birmingham city centre, and an underbridge along the Coleshill Heath Road, continues off Coleshill Heath Road from their Heath Park compound. In the coming months, overnight single lane closures will also be installed along short sections of the M6 near junction 4 to enable BBV to safely undertake a variety of surveys.

NEW DESIGNS REVEALED FOR HS2'S AUTOMATED PEOPLE MOVER

HS2 has been working closely with the Urban



Growth Company (UGC) to include extra design elements around the Interchange area to support wider growth plans at the UK Central Hub. Last month, HS2 submitted a Schedule 17 planning application for an option to realign a short section of the Automated People Mover (APM), which will take people from Interchange Station, over the M42 and into the NEC, Birmingham International Station and Birmingham Airport.

UK Central: Designs revealed for HS2 car parking project



PUBLIC VIEWS SOUGHT ON MAJOR BUILDING SCHEME

 Members of the public are being asked for their views on the design of a major building project which is set to support the creation of thousands of new jobs and homes at The UK Central Hub in Solihull.

Solihull Council's Urban Growth Company (UGC) will be presenting its plans for new multi-storey car parking at a site on the outskirts of Solihull known as Arden Cross, which will be the location of the new HS2 Interchange Station.

The multi-storey proposal is a vital element of creating the new jobs, homes and economic growth associated with the arrival of high speed rail in the region. There is a requirement for approximately 7,000 spaces to be provided for passengers using the new Interchange Station and, under the consented scheme, these spaces will all be at surface level. The UGC proposal is to consolidate those spaces into multi-storey car parking in a phased way, so that valuable development land at Arden Cross can be freed up to create a new, vibrant destination consisting of homes, businesses and leisure opportunities.

The UGC is working on the project with HS2 Ltd and other partners to ensure the arrival of high-speed rail delivers important regional benefits such as new jobs and homes.

'The Hub' is a 1,300-hectare area of land in Solihull near the M42, which comprises Birmingham Airport,



the National Exhibition Centre, Jaguar Land Rover, Birmingham Business Park and the 140-hectare Arden Cross, which will be home to the HS2 Interchange Station. By 2030, the UGC predicts that The Hub will be an environment that supports 8,000 new homes and 70,000 new and existing jobs, while boosting the economy by £6.2bn every year. 1.3m people will also have been brought to within a 45-minute public transport commute of The Hub.

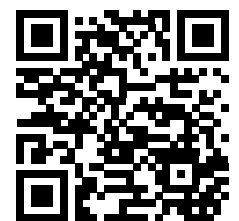
