# Self-driving shuttle bus trialled at BBP

## SOLIHULL COUNCIL'S FUTURISTIC VEHICLE COMES TO THE PARK

Solihull Council's state-of-theart self-driving shuttle took passengers around Birmingham Business Park in the latest round of on-road trials.

This most recent deployment forms part of a wider Council-led project which aims to test out how Connected Autonomous Vehicles (CAVs) might be safely and seamlessly integrated into the borough's transport network in the future.

Solihull is already playing a leading role in the development and deployment of CAV technology. In 2021 Solihull Council became the first local authority in the country to purchase its own electric and fully autonomous shuttle, using a grant from the Greater Birmingham & Solihull Local Enterprise Partnership (GBSLEP).

Since then, successful passenger trials have been carried out at both Birmingham Airport and the NEC, where the shuttle was also used in the Commonwealth Games Queen's Baton Relay. Building on the success of these deployments, this latest trial saw the shuttle take to Solihull's roads once again, this time transporting passengers along a pre-mapped loop of the business park while again interacting with other road users.

Designed and manufactured by Coventry's Aurrigo, the futuristic





looking Auto-Shuttle can carry up to ten passengers and uses a suite of sensors, including LiDAR, to understand its surroundings and move around safely. For the purposes of testing, the shuttle was limited to a top speed of 20mph. In line with current legislation, a safety operator was The shuttle bus's smart interior and eye-catching exterior

on-board at all times, and was able to take control of the shuttle at any point if required

As well as Business Park employees, the passenger trials were also open to members of the public who wanted to experience one of the first fully selfdriving shuttles in the UK.

The CAV ran at Birmingham Business Park until the end of March.

These trials have provided Solihull Council and its partners with real-world test cases and data which is being used to better understand how this technology might be used in the future.

Larger scale plans for a Multi-Area Connected Automated Mobility (MACAM) project have also been announced. Overseen by a regional consortium led by leading autonomous technology provider Conigital, part of this exciting development project will seek to establish a new permanent commercial route between Birmingham International rail station and Birmingham Business Park through the NEC using a new fleet of self-driving vehicles. The trials at BBP will be used as an important pathfinder project ahead of this more ambitious project.

"The results of this trial will provide further knowledge and experience of self-driving vehicles in a real-world environment, helping to inform our future mobility services and highway infrastructure design across Solihull and the wider region."

"Operating in a busy, but controlled environment, we hope these latest trials will help to provide even more real-world operating experience which can be used to further improve efficiency and safety for passengers.

"We are really excited to be working with Solihull Council on this, and to gain valuable insight into ways we may be able to further improve our site access and transport links, while also working towards our net zero carbon ambitions."

#### **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

#### What is an autonomous shuttle?

An autonomous shuttle (also known as a self-driving or driverless vehicle), is a vehicle that uses a range of sensors to understand its surroundings – allowing it to move around safely with little or no operator input. For these trials there will always be a safety operator on-board.

#### How is the shuttle powered?

The shuttle is fully electric and has a range of 100 miles. The vehicle is charged at the end of each day.

#### How is this project being funded?

The project has been funded by a grant from the GBSLEP alongside support from the West Midlands Combined Authority.

#### How fast does it go? How do sense p

The shuttle is capable of operating up to 20mph in autonomous mode.

### How does the shuttle sense pedestrians and cyclists?

The shuttle is aware of their environment via many sensors – this means the shuttle will have the ability to stop itself in an emergency or if there is an unexpected hazard in the road. There is also a safety operator on-board at all times who is able to take full control of the vehicle at any time.

#### Spring gardening tips from the BBP landscaping team at Nurture Landscapes



#### **1 PLAN AHEAD**

Spring is the perfect time to plan your garden for the upcoming year. Consider what plants you want to grow and how much space you have available. Make sure to take into account the soil type and light conditions.

#### **2 WATCH THE WEATHER**

The weather in the UK can be unpredictable, so it's important you keep an eye on the forecast and adjust your gardening schedule accordingly. If a frost is expected, cover delicate plants with protection. If there is a prolonged dry spell, make sure to water your plants regularly.

#### 3 CONSIDER COMPANION PLANTING

Companion planting involves growing different plants together that benefit each other. For example, planting herbs like basil or chives alongside tomatoes can help to repel pests and improve flavour. Research companion planting options that work well for your garden and try incorporating them into your planting plan.

#### **4 CREATE A COMPOST AREA**

It isn't too late to start yours if you haven't already, as it's the perfect way to recycle your organic waste! Plants thrive from rich nutrients, so a good mixture of grass trimmings, vegetable peelings and wooden pruning's will create the perfect compost mix for your garden. Don't forget to keep regularly turning your compost with a fork to keep it aerated!

#### **5 KEEP IT TIDY**

Regularly remove dead leaves and debris from your garden beds to prevent the buildup of pests and diseases. Also, keep your garden tools clean and well-maintained to ensure they are ready to use when needed.

Park is a pleasure for me, as I love to show people how to relax and forget their worries by introducing them to a new experience in art.



Steven Singh, Centre Manager at Regus, who took part in the event, said: "Paper crafting was great, there were so many bright colours and creative ideas to share with one another.


"It really helped break up the day and also a change from the office and a brilliant way to make new friends or contacts and network. This activity is great for them mind, and an amazing way to show off your creativity."

Beth is Poet in Residence at University Hospitals Bristol & Weston NHS Foundation Trust, Oxford University Hospitals NHS FT and the Clatterbridge Cancer Centre in Liverpool. She has been a Poet in Residence for The Poetry House in Ledbury (2021-22), a Bristol Poetry Festival Resident Poet (2021), a Bristol Life Awards Arts Finalist (2020), and a Roundhouse Slam Finalist (2018). She has worked with the BBC, ITV, Sky, and many more.

Beth travels across the country to places of work, care, learning and play – from hospitals to festivals, weddings to woodlands, high streets to heritage sites, schools to universities, meeting rooms to theatres – performing, facilitating and co-creating poetry.

# How Clean & Green are working together for a brighter Solihull

#### LOCAL COMMUNITY PROJECT NEEDS YOUR SUPPORT

"You'll never get the volunteers", Paul 'Pablo' Sultana was told when he decided to ask people to help clean up the streets and green spaces of North Solihull.

But just five years later Pablo, who used to work at Birmingham Business Park, has proved his doubters wrong.

The community group he created, Clean & Green, has grown from one volunteer to 930. They've removed more than 15,000 bags of rubbish and cleared more than 250 shopping trolleys from local watercourses and lobbied local supermarkets about the issue.

"North Solihull often gets bad press or is seen as the poorer relation to South and Central Solihull," says Pablo, who used to be Group Head of Health, Safety and Environment at WM Housing at BPP, now known as Citizen Housing.

"But we have a strong and caring community who pull together and support each other and look after our precious green spaces."

Clean & Green also carries out tree and bulb planting and helps renovate parks and neglected public areas around Chelmsley Wood, Kingshurst, Smiths Wood and the surrounding areas. It also runs wellbeing walks and has given out free wildlife cameras, binoculars and wild bird food and feeders to encourage people to care for local wildlife.

Clean & Green has won awards for its work, including Solihull Borough Council's Community Environment Award 2023.



Pablo would love to see people from Birmingham Business Park get involved with its activities, whether through litter picking or helping with tasks like marketing and printing flyers. The group's also looking for businesses to donate equipment and funds.

Clean & Green has a wish list, which can be found on its Facebook page, which includes safety footwear, wild flower seeds, tree saplings and litter picking sticks.

"We also desperately need to find a second hand vehicle, ideally a small van, to store and transport our equipment and have some funds or prizes to help us incentivise volunteers," says Pablo

## **High-speed rail stats** reveal local growth

New figures released by HS2 Ltd show that over the last six years, 422 West Midlands companies have received a share of over £1.7bn in contract awards.

The figures demonstrate how HS2's construction is playing a vital role in the survival and growth of businesses across the region.

Small and medium sized businesses based in the area are emerging as the biggest winners, with a 78% share of local contract awards.

In 2022 alone, the value of HS2 contracts awarded to local firms (£816million) totalled almost twice the value of economic uplift delivered in the West Midlands by the 2022 Birmingham Commonwealth Games (£453.7million).

HS2's impact is being felt near Birmingham Business Park, with a new Interchange Station that will serve Solihull, Birmingham Airport and

The new HS2 Interchange Station will be part of a new public transport interchange serving Solihull and the West Midlands, with links to local roads and the UK motorway network, making it one of the best-connected places in the UK.

The positive effect of HS2's construction is also being felt by local people working on the project, developing their careers, and accessing free training to upskill for new opportunities.

Balfour Beatty VINCI, HS2's construction partner for the region, has already delivered over 81,000 hours of training to create the 7,000-strong highly skilled workforce it needs to fulfil a wide variety of on-site and officebased roles.



#### TRAFFIC **MANAGEMENT FOR M42 BOX STRUCTURE**

Balfour Beatty Vinci (BBV) will be constructing a new 'box structure' over the M42 near Birmingham **Business Park. A box structure is a** type of road bridge that will allow four HS2 rail tracks to pass over the motorway at an angle. It is 130 metres in length so to a road user, it will feel like you have entered a short tunnel rather than passing under a bridge.

The construction of the proposed box structure will begin with the demolition of the A446 bridge, the southern part of the Northway Island (roundabout). The planned demolition date is over the weekend of 12th-13th August 2023 and will require the motorway to be closed between Junction 6 and Junction 9.

Prior to the bridge demolition. BBV will be carrying out several preparatory tasks in the vicinity leading to this target date. These tasks include vegetation clearance, earthworks, utility diversions in the area and the removal of existing street furniture such as street lighting columns, Vehicle Restraint System (VRS), street signs, gantries and so on but also a National Roads **Telecommunications Services** (NRTS) temporary diversion.

The proposed works will impact the surrounding traffic networks around the Business Park, specifically along the M42 between the two bridges.

**Traffic Management will need** to be put in place resulting in the closure of the Hard Shoulder in both directions.

The traffic management will initially be in place at night but from May onwards will be in place on a permanent basis until demolition in the summer.

The summer sees the arrival of live music sessions and outdoor theatre performances, including Shakespeare's Taming of the Shrew and David Walliams' Bad Dad.

A Lego workshop with Lego Masters Kevin and Emily from Brick Galleria and a Murder Mystery are also planned.

To mark the Summer Solstice on June 20 you can watch the sun go down over Birmingham from the Garden's hillside vantage point. There's even a chance to camp and watch the sunrise.

For little ones the Gardens host regular Forest Schools and activities like

pond dipping and nature-inspired arts

and crafts.
Young explorers can also learn more about nature with a free Percy the Park Keeper self-guided trail and seasonal activities. Four-legged friends are catered for too. Pooches enjoy a free doggy muffin with every hot drink purchased at the monthly 'Canine Café' held in the Courtyard Café.
